

IS MY CAT AT RISK FOR DEVELOPING FELINE VIRAL RHINOTRACHEITIS (FVR)?

The virus is easily spread and very contagious, therefore any cat is at high risk of the exposure to FVR.

MY CAT WAS VACCINATED. CAN SHE STILL GET THE DISEASE?

Many cats are exposed to the virus before their vaccination and contract the disease. Vaccination of kittens weaned from vaccinated queens is not always successful because maternal immunity may inhibit a kitten's response to the vaccine.

IS FVR A CHRONIC DISEASE?

The virus may remain dormant in the nerves for years, although many cats will experience flare-ups and may develop chronic disease. The flare-ups may be triggered by many kinds of stress, including the introduction of a new cat, boarding, moving, and others. The chronic disease appears as frequent or systematic sneezing, congestion, runny nose and eyes, conjunctivitis, face ulcers, skin lesions, and more.

IS CHRONIC FVR TREATABLE?

While chronic FVR treatment is not licensed by USDA at this time, multiple cases of chronic FVR & herpetic disease have been successfully treated with Polyprenyl ImmunostimulantTM.

What is

FELINE VIRAL RHINOTRACHEITIS?

Feline Herpesvirus (FHV) is a common cause of ubiquitous upper respiratory infection (URI) in cats. The disease is called Feline Viral Rhinotracheitis (FVR).

FHV is very contagious. Weak, immune compromised cats, and cats in multi-cat environments are at a high risk of exposure to the virus and will likely develop the disease. FVR may become chronic, cause blindness, and even be fatal to young or weak cats.

Chronic patients commonly have nasal and ocular signs. Some cats may develop dermatitis and/or keratitis.

SIGNS OF DISEASE

- Sneezing, congestion, runny nose
- Watery eyes, conjunctivitis, eye discharge
- Face ulcers, skin lesions
- Fever, mouth breathing, salivation
- Appetite loss, lethargy

PI corrects what the virus broke in the cat's body: the innate immune response. PI controls the virus-triggered overreaction (inflammation) while supporting the defensive response.

PI restores and rebalances the cat's immunity which is central to feeling healthy. In addition to Polyprenyl Immunostimulant™ (PI) veterinarians recommend a concurrent course of antibiotics because antibiotic targets bacteriologic component of the illness. PI is doing what antibiotic or antiviral can't – restore virus-damaged immune system.

IS POLYPRENYL IMMUNOSTIMULANT™ SAFE FOR MY CAT?

Polyprenyl Immunostimulant™ (PI) is a very safe product. PI was used for thousands of cats as a treatment for FVR (USDA licensed), and also in various experimental treatments, such as **chronic FVR, FIP, herpetic dermatitis and keratitis.** No side effects ever happened in any animal.

▶ WHAT IS THE RECOMMENDED DOSAGE FOR RHINOTRACHEITIS (FVR)?

The suggested oral dose is 0.5 mg/kg twice daily for 15 days. However, your veterinarian may specify a different schedule for your cat. On average, a kitten will need approximately 1 vial and a small cat 2-3 vials for a complete treatment course.
